The Everest

Old Vine Grenache 2016

Heritage

This wine represents the absolute pinnacle of winemaking here at Château Tanunda. We select only the very best grapes from individual vineyard blocks in exceptional vintages and set aside only the highest quality part of the fermented wines for maturation in the finest French oak only. We then make a barrel selection of the finest wines to produce no more than three barrels of the pinnacle, or Everest, of that vintage.

Vineyard

The 2016 vintage comes from a small parcel of 100+ year old Grenache bush vines from the Greenock sub-region of the Barossa. Yields from these vines have naturally reduced to less than 1ton/acre with careful viticultural management, allowing for optimum ripening conditions and best possible quality Grenache.

Winemaking

The grapes are hand-picked and sorted before destemming and fermenting in small open fermenters. We gently hand plunge the must four times per day for a gentle extraction of aromas, colour and tannins. After careful basket pressing, the wine is matured in finest French oak barrels for 18 months, prior to a further 24 months bottle maturation in our cellars.

Tasting Note

The nose displays notes of blueberry, kirsch, marzipan and an intense licorice spice. The wine is incredibly dense and multi-layered yet still retains an elegance and softness as well as a textural purity the few wines can achieve. Supple tannins from the gentle basket press merely complement the fruit, silky and rich yet impressively interwoven into the wine.
